The Israeli Electric Corporation (IEC) controls more than 95% of the electricity sector in Israel, and controls production, distribution, and transmission of electricity.

Currently, only 14% of Israel's electricity is generated from renewables like wind and solar, starkly contrasting with the European Union, where 48% of electricity came from clean sources ...

Israel endorsed a target of generating 10% of the country's electricity from renewable sources in 2020. Solar thermal and photovoltaic power plants are expected to account for over 70% of total ...

Israel is on track to meet its goal of, by 2030, producing a third of its electricity through renewable sources, Energy and Infrastructure Minister Eli Cohen told the Knesset Economic Affairs...

Israel's electricity sector relies mainly on fossil fuels. In 2015, energy consumption in Israel was 52.86 TWh, or 6,562 kWh per capita. The Israel Electric Corporation (IEC), which is owned by the government, produces most electricity in Israel, with a production capacity of 11,900 megawatts in 2016. In 2016, IEC's share of the electricity market was 71%.

As the push for a carbon-neutral future accelerates, Israel's renewable energy ecosystem provides not just technology--but a blueprint for clean, resilient, and smart energy solutions worldwide.

Currently, around 18% of Israel's energy comes from renewables, primarily solar power. They aim to further enhance this percentage by promoting energy efficiency and exploring alternative ...
