Should Africa install solar panels?

A region synonymous with abundant sun is hungry for more electricity. Given Africa's colossal untapped solar radiation, the continent should be installing solar panels at a furious pace. But it's not. Though home to 60% of the world's best solar resources, Africa today represents just 1% of installed solar photovoltaic capacity.

This work reviewed solar PV potential in Africa for three generational time-scales: present, near future and far future. For the present, the potential of wide scale rooftop solar PV systems was reviewed, particularly in African cities.

Can rooftop solar PV be scaled up in Africa?

Scaling up application of rooftop solar PV in Africa still faces multi-faceted challenges as detailed earlier in the PESTLE analyses. African cities are not lacking solar resources but suffer from the deficit of technological capacity along with the limited financial and regulatory supports to utilise these.
